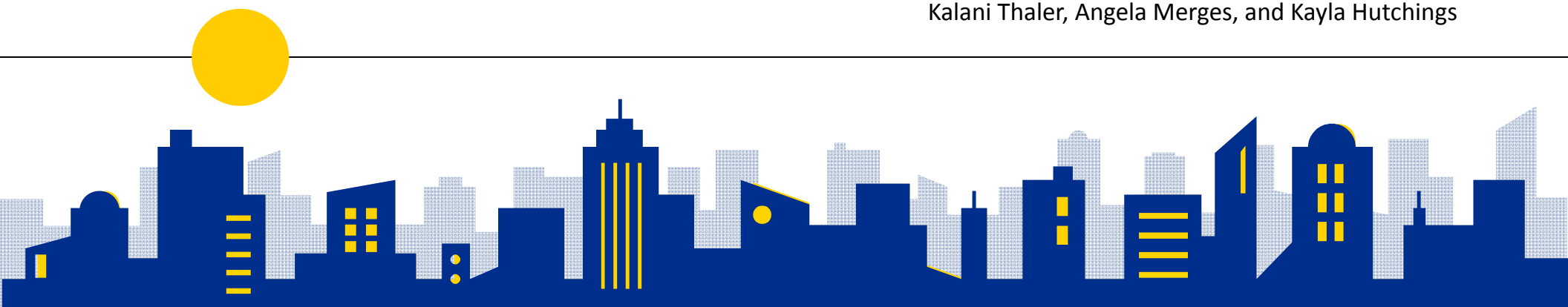

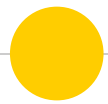


Project Objectives and BHIV Programs Overview

- ◉ Design and implement a new health services information system to replace the Electronic System for HIV/AIDS Reporting and Evaluation (eSHARE)

- ◉ Bureau of HIV/AIDS Prevention and Control (BHIV)
 - Care and Treatment Program
 - Administers funds awarded under the New York Eligible Metropolitan Area (EMA) Ryan White Part A Program

 - HIV Prevention Program
 - Oversees services aimed at preventing the transmission of HIV, including HIV testing, PrEP or PEP, screening or treatment for STI and Hepatitis C



eSHARE Overview

- Web-based data reporting system
 - Allows real time access to data by NYC Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (NYC DOHMH) and funded agencies
- Captures demographics, enrollments, services (individual and group), referrals, assessments and outcome measures over time
- Mirrors order of activities with client, in forms flow
- Includes canned reports and extracts

eSHARE versus New System

eSHARE

- Form-based system
- Programs or service categories are separate
- Modifications made only by IT or developers
- Only canned reports

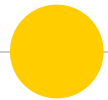
Future Information System

- Event-based system
- Complete picture of all service models for a client
- Easily configurable via administrative interface
- User-defined reports and Ad hoc queries



Current Project Phase

- Functional Specifications for Core Modules
 - Blueprint for Future Information System
- Data Governance
 - Analysis and understanding of past patterns of data-related decision making
 - Formalized processes and communication channels
