BioSense Platform ESSENCE Processing Backlog:

▪ The BioSense Platform production ESSENCE has reduced the backlog from 14 million records (announced Monday, May 20, 2019) to six million today. We expect the backlog to be resolved in the next two or three days.

Dear NSSP Community of Practice Members:

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the International Society for Disease Surveillance (ISDS) are strong advocates for syndromic surveillance - both the science, and the practice.

One way in which CDC has provided its support is by funding a partner organization to facilitate the [NSSP Community of Practice \(CoP\)](#). For three years, **ISDS has served in this role and been a valued partner in advancing syndromic surveillance and energizing the community**. CDC and ISDS have worked on your behalf to build a strong, *sustainable* community of practice.

On May 7, 2019, NSSP representatives spoke with members of the NSSP CoP Steering Committee and leadership teams for the NSSP CoP committees and workgroups about CDC's cooperative agreement with ISDS. **The current cooperative agreement with ISDS for support of the NSSP CoP will end June 30, 2019.** It will be replaced by a new partner cooperative agreement being competed through CDC's [Center for State, Tribal, Local, and Territorial Support National Partnership \(CSTLTS\)](#) [cooperative agreement](#).
