

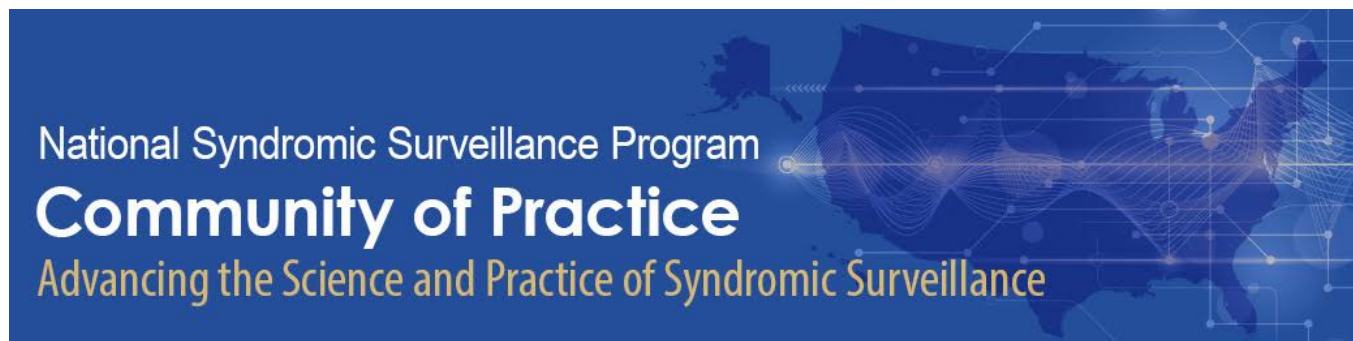


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Now Open! Call for Abstracts - 2021 Syndromic Surveillance Symposium
