Subject: Group 1 CSTE Law Project - July 23rd Presentation Materials and Next Steps

Hello all,

My apologies in advance for this lengthy email. I need to address several items I had intended to cover on yesterday's planned Group 1 call.

Attached is the presentation I was going to review with you yesterday. I'm also attaching the slide handouts in a PDF file. (Both these are also available on the Law Project's Basecamp website.) The attached presentation has three sections:

- **Overall toolkit revisions** – Summarizes changes to all the toolkits based on feedback from all the groups.
- **EAI toolkit revisions** – Planned revisions to this toolkit
- **Emergency Volunteer toolkit revisions** – Planned revisions to this toolkit

There are a few important items flagged in the presentation that I'd like your input on, which I have posed in the "notes" section in the slide presentation. These items are generally:

- EAI toolkit:
 - Slide 16: RE: Key Federal Laws (e.g., PAHPAI, PREP Act, etc.) – Considering expanding the current 2-page fact sheets to included more in-depth coverage/discussion of these key federal laws. Is this useful?
- Emergency Volunteers toolkit:
 - Slide 23: RE: Executive Summary – The existing fact sheet and others in the Em Vol toolkit cover several federal laws (e.g., Fed Tort Claims Act, Vol Protection Act), yet we don't have stand-alone documents for these laws like we do for PAHPAI, Stafford Act, etc. in the EAI toolkit. Should we create separate documents for the federal laws referenced in this toolkit? (They could also be used in the EAI toolkit)
 - Slide 24: RE: Liability, etc. Issue Briefs – Should/can we use the same three issue briefs on liability, immunity and compensation that will be used in the EAI toolkit? OR Should we create a separate issue brief for liability, immunity and compensation for the Em Vols toolkit? OR Should we do both?

Please feel free to send me your thoughts via email or schedule a time to speak with me one-on-one about these or any other items in the proposed revisions.

Finally, some information about next steps:

- I will begin rolling out drafts of the new toolkit documents in the coming weeks. I will be concentrating on one toolkit at a time during the writing process, so release of the drafts will be staggered according to this loose schedule:
 - EAI – week of 8/5 or 8/12
 - Emergency Volunteer – week of 8/12 or 8/19
 - Information Sharing – week of 8/19 or 8/26
 - PH and Schools – week of 8/26
 - EUA – week of 9/2
 - Scope of Practice – week of 9/2
- I may be reaching out to one or more of you individually to follow-up on items and resources you mentioned on our prior calls.
- We will be sending out calendar invites to continue our schedule of bi-weekly group calls. **Please note that we will most likely NOT hold a call every two weeks in August/September**, but would like to reserve the time should we need it to review feedback about the documents. If this is a problem for your schedule, just let us know. **We will send you cancellation notices if we do not intend to hold a call.**
