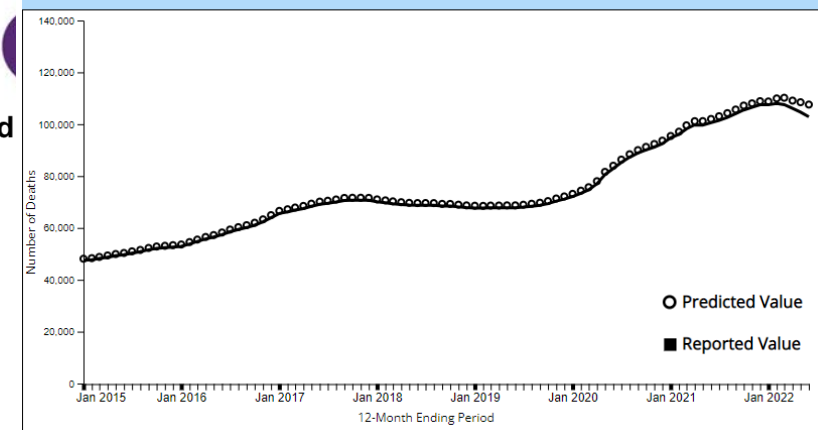
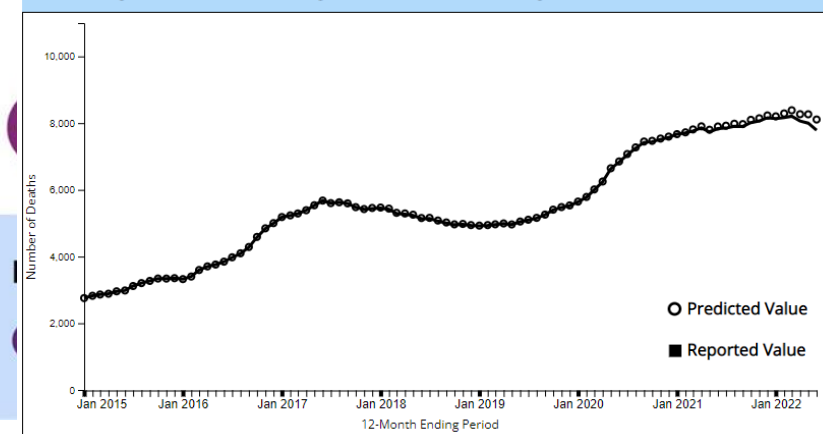


Figure 1a. 12 Month-ending Provisional Counts of Drug Overdose Deaths: Florida

Coordinated Opioid Recovery
A NETWORK OF ADDICTION CARE



Program Goal: Develop a seamless, collaborative, stabilization, and treatment solution to reduce opioid-related overdoses, recidivism, and mortality.

- **Peer Support Specialists**, individuals living with substance use disorder and co-occurring mental health conditions; while enhancing **personal and family life** through recovery.
 - Receive peer support only or **peer support** and linkage to **substance use and mental health treatment**.
 - Address health inequities by providing **wraparound services**, access to appropriate **medication assisted treatment**, **plans of safe care for moms**, and more!
- **Pilot tested and expanded citywide** to seven additional area hospitals with at least one more hospital currently negotiating an agreement to bring the program to their locations.

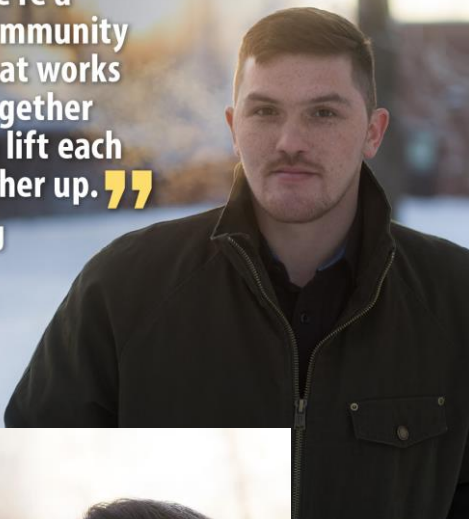
ProQOL Results February 21 – October 22

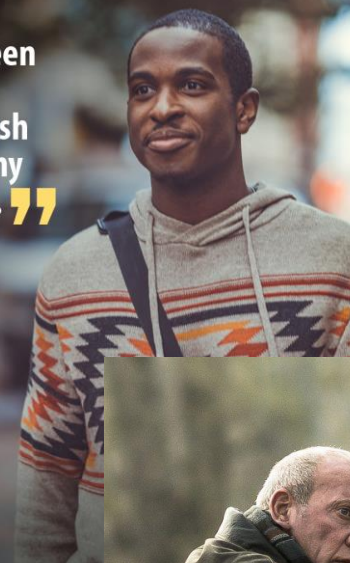
