My current responsibilities include surveillance for communicable diseases and for cancer in Florida, the BRFSS and PRAMS surveillance systems, investigation of acute and chronic health problems, consultation on MCH and injury epidemiology issues, and epidemiologic support to the evaluation of Florida's Pilot Program to reduce youth tobacco use.

Jesse Greenblatt MD, MPH
Member At Large

It is with great excitement that I was informed of being a candidate for the CSTE executive council. It has been my pleasure to be involved with CSTE beginning in 1993 and I have been a continuous member since. During this time I have served on a number of consultancies most recently serving as the lead consultant on enteric diseases. Food safety and enteric disease has been tremendously active subject driven by national interest in outbreaks and the resultant 1997 President's Food Safety Initiative. While there has been great progress, particularly with CDC's sponsored FoodNet and PulseNet, there is still a great need for work in the area of multi-jurisdictional, multi-state foodborne outbreak investigations. I believe CSTE can serve a valuable role in helping to direct federal agencies to better meet the needs of state and local health jurisdictions for outbreak and trace back investigations. It would be my hope to bring the knowledge gained from my experiences with FDA and USDA to the CSTE executive committee. It has been my view that while CSTE is experiencing new challenges, it remains a vibrant organization with a highly committed membership. It has always impressed me that there has been such significant involvement and stability of its membership over the years. It would be the realization of a personal goal to serve the membership.

My training has included a medical degree with honors from the University of Colorado Health Science Center and a residency in Preventive Medicine through the Johns Hopkins University School of Hygiene and Public Health. Steven C. Macdonald PhD, MPH, is Epidemiologist in the Non-Infectious Conditions Epidemiology section at Washington State Department of Health Office of Epidemiology. From 1995-97, he was assigned to the Surveillance Branch at the CDC National Center for Environmental Health in Atlanta. He has previously worked for the University of Washington (UW) School of Public Health as a health policy analyst, and the UW School of Medicine as a research scientist in preventive medicine.

Dr Macdonald's special area of interest is public health surveillance, and in 1998 he was awarded a CDC asthma surveillance data evaluation grant. In 1997, he chaired the CDC Steering Committee on Case Definitions for Non-Infectious Conditions Surveillance. He currently holds a clinical faculty appointment at the UW Department of Epidemiology, and has taught courses in public health practice, and public health surveillance.

Dr Macdonald received his masters in community medicine, and doctoral degree in epidemiology, from the University of Washington, and was awarded fellowships in Health Services Research, and Environmental Pathology and Toxicology.

Dr Macdonald is a former chair of the Injury Control and Emergency Health Services section of American Public Health Association, and former member of the board of directors for the American Trauma Society. He currently chairs the Healthy People 2010 Consultancy for the Council of State and Territorial Epidemiologists (CSTE), co-chairs the CSTE Data Release Guidelines Workgroup, and sits on the CSTE Surveillance Work Group.

Environmental/Occupational/Injury Chair

Dr. Kelter has been the Chief, Epidemiology & Prevention for Injury Control (EPIC) Branch, California Department of Health Services since 1989. Since that time, the Branch has:

- Developed a Strategic Plan for Injury Prevention in California
- Developed a Strategic Plan for Disability Prevention in California
- Granted about \$5 million to local programs for injury/violence prevention
- Launched exploratory methods of surveillance for family violence in California (focus on child abuse and intimate partner violence)
- Coordinated statewide efforts to improve child safety in autos, bicycles and swimming pools
- Published first-ever epidemiological reports on various aspects of fatal and hospitalized injuries in California
- Trained over a dozen young public health professionals in violence prevention and injury epidemiology.

Dr. Kelter has a B.A., M.D. and a Preventive Medicine Residency from the University of Arizona, and is certified by the American Board of Preventive Medicine. Before coming to California in 1982, he worked at the State of Arizona Department of Health Services and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control where in 1981 he participated in the first investigation into the outbreak of illnesses that we now call AIDS. In Arizona between 1976 and 1980, and in California between 1982 and 1989, Dr. Kelter led various programs and studies involving environmental and occupational disease epidemiology and the health effects of toxic substances, and was California's acting Deputy Director for Public Health from 1986-88 under then Director Dr. Kenneth W. Kizer.

Candidate for Member At Large

Public health — especially at a state or local health department - was not the career path I expected to take when I graduated from medical school. But after volunteer work overseas in Thailand and Nepal and with the Indian Health Service in New Mexico and Alaska, an infectious disease fellowship that focused on hospital epidemiology, and two years of EIS, I have settled into my current position as Assistant Commissioner of the Communicable Disease Program at the New York City Department of Health.

Infectious disease surveillance and control in a city as complex as New York has been both challenging and rewarding. My areas of interest are varied, and have ranged from antibiotic resistance and waterborne diseases to developing a preparedness program for biologic disasters, including bioterrorism. Recognizing the need to rethink the way we monitor disease conditions, our Program has developed innovative tools for tracking clinical syndromes as early warning systems for outbreaks and is moving towards an integrated approach to field surveillance and data management that focuses on looking at disease from a patient-based and community-based perspective as opposed to just focusing on trends by individual diseases.

I am currently a participating member of the Johns Hopkins Center for Civilian Biodefense Studies, the Institute of Medicine's Forum on Emerging Infectious Diseases and the JFK School of Government's Executive Session on Domestic Preparedness. During this past year, I have also been honored to receive the Special Merit Award from the Public Health Association of New York City and the Sloan Public Service Award for outstanding civil service.

I am one of the founding member of a sister organization to CSTE - The Council of Overworked City Epidemiologists - that includes communicable disease directors from the local health departments in Boston, Philadelphia, Miami, Chicago, Los Angeles and Seattle. We meet on monthly conference calls to discuss a specific topic -- that range from the challenges we face in implementing effective surveillance programs for specific diseases or conditions (*e.g., hepatitis C surveillance*), or the practicalities of responding to different acute communicable disease events in various settings (*e.g., case or outbreak management in schools*). In addition to the areas of interest I have mentioned, I would hope to bring the perspectives and concerns that face epidemiologists in large urban health departments to the CSTE Executive Committee.
