

Ed Thompson, M.D., M.P.H., is Deputy Director for Public Health Services of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

Before coming to CDC, Dr. Thompson served for 9 1/2 years as the State Health Officer of Mississippi. He holds an M.D. degree from the University of Mississippi School of Medicine and an M.P.H. degree from the Johns Hopkins School of Hygiene and Public Health. He is board certified in Preventive Medicine.

Prior to becoming Mississippi's State Health Officer, he served as Mississippi's State Epidemiologist for 10 years. He is a past president of the Council of State and Territorial Epidemiologists (CSTE), and the Association of State and Territorial Health Officials (ASTHO).

Dr. Thompson served a four-year term on the CDC's Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP), and was a member the Advisory Committee to the Director of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), and the Department of Health and Human Services' Secretary's Council on Public Health Preparedness.
